## STUDENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT

(2022-2023)

Students are considered to be the main stakeholders of the teaching learning procedure. The feedback of students therefore, is considered to be of utmost priority for the overall growth and development of the institution. The institution designed Student Feedback forms comprising of a total of 28 questions which included four (04) different aspects like- I) Course content and teaching learning process, II) Evaluation process, III) Infrastructure and facility development and IV) Administration. The responses of the students were recorded on a 5-point rating scale and suggestions were sought. During the academic year 2022-23, a total of 381 responses have been received from the students.

### A) COURSE CONTENT AND TEACHING LEARNING PROCESS









## **TEACHERS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT** **(Session: 2022-23)**


Teachers are the foundation of educational institutions as they are burdened with the responsibility of developing the intellectual ideas and nurturing the students that is essential for nation building. They bear the primary responsibility for providing quality education. Teachers' feedback plays a crucial role in directing the efficient management of the course delivery process. As such, PDUAM, Tulungia highly values the teachers' feedback system and has integrated it into the framework for efficient course design and delivery. The institution also firmly believes that the insights gained from the teachers' feedback will be instrumental in leading the institution towards excellence and continuous improvement. For every academic year, the institution collects teacher feedback and examines the responses collected on various dimensions assumed to be important for the teaching and learning aspect, in the Academic Development Cell meeting at the end of each academic session.

During the academic year 2022-23, teachers have been surveyed regarding their perspectives on fifteen key dimensions, encompassing different aspects of the syllabus, internal examination mechanism, institutions evaluation system, infrastructural facilities, library facility, availability and maintenance of ICT facilities, institution's grievance Redressal system, welfare measures, institutions financial support for professional development of the teachers', adoption of new techniques of teaching and learning, communication of information and canteen facility. The feedback has been collected using a 5-point rating scale, ranging from ***Strongly Agree*** to ***Strongly Disagree***. For the analysis, a statistical tool, particularly a pie chart has been employed and is presented as follows:



#### TEACHERS FEEDBACK INTERPRETATION:

1. 47 percent of the respondents strongly agreed and a majority of 53 percent of the respondents agreed to the statement that the syllabus of the affiliating university is designed to engage students, align with current trends, and meet industry demand and contribute to scientific community.

2. The statement that the syllabus is effective in preparing students for competitive examinations and enhances their employability, majority of the respondents, i.e. 50 percent of the respondents agreed and 35 percent strongly agreed. Additionally, 8 percent have disagreed with the statement and 12 percent of respondents stayed neutral and 3 percent disagreed to the fact.
3. In response to the statement, the syllabus prioritizes holistic learning, including practical and ethical dimensions, a highest of 56 percent agreed, 38 percent strongly agreed whereas 6 percent of the respondents decided to stay neutral on the statement.
4. About the statement on the allotted time is adequate for syllabus completion. 15 percent of the respondents have chosen not to express their opinion. However, a majority of 44 percent strongly agreed and 41 percent of the respondents agreed.
5. The institutional academic calendar and the internal examination mechanism effectively contribute to curriculum delivery and its overall effectiveness. In response to this statement 71 percent of the respondents strongly agreed and 26 percent of the respondents agreed. However, only 3 percent of the respondents did not express their opinion.
6. 79 percent of the respondents strongly agreed that the institution's evaluation system is effective, fair, and transparent in assessing students' academic performance. Additionally, 21 percent of the respondents agreed to the statement.
7. The statement, the institutional infrastructural facilities such as departmental rooms, library, classrooms, washrooms, water purifier cooler and laboratories are well-maintained fetched that 59 percent of the respondents strongly agreed followed by 41 percent of the respondents who agreed to the statement.
8. As regards the statement on the institutions' central library collection and digital library facility effectively supports your academic research and study requirements, majority of the respondents, i.e. 53 percent have agreed while 35 percent of the respondents have strongly agreed. However, 12 percent of the respondents have chosen to remain neutral.
9. In response to the statement regarding the availability and maintenance of ICT facilities, WI-Fi, internet connectivity and laboratory instruments are regularly assessed to ensure they are in working condition and adequately serviced, 59 percent of the respondents have agreed followed by 32 percent of the respondents

who have strongly agreed. Whereas 9 percent of the respondents chose not to express their opinion.

10. A majority of 53 percent of the respondents have strongly agreed to the statement that the institution's grievance system is transparent and accessible to all teaching and non-teaching staff/students, followed by 44 percent who have agreed and 3 percent of the respondents who remained neutral.
11. With regards to the statement on the institution's welfare measures effectively support the well-being and job satisfaction. 71 percent of the respondents have agreed and 29 percent of the respondents have strongly agreed to the statement.
12. On being enquired regarding the institution's financial support for the professional development or research endeavor is satisfactory, only 21 percent of the respondents have strongly agreed and 38 percent of the respondents have agreed to the statement. Moreover, 38 percent of the respondents have decided not express any opinion and 3 percent of the respondents have disagreed to the statement.
13. Regarding the statement that the institution encourages teachers to adopt new techniques/ strategies of teaching and learning 50 percent of the respondents have agreed followed by 47 percent who have strongly agreed. However, 3 percent of the respondents stayed neutral.
14. A majority of 65 percent of the respondents have strongly agreed to the statement that the communication of information and notices is timely and well-organized within the institution. 32 percent of the respondents have agreed to the statement while 3 percent of the respondents have chosen to remain neutral.
15. On a query regarding whether the institution has a hygienic canteen facility, 50 percent of the respondents agreed and 44 percent strongly agreed to it. However 3 percent of the respondents disagreed to the statement and 3 percent of the respondents chose not express their opinion.

#### **ACTION TAKEN REPORT:**

The Academic Development Cell meeting has addressed the responses received from teachers for the academic year 2022-23. 1. Participation of all the teachers in proper working mechanism of the college.


2. Installation of CCTV in every classroom and requirement of additional smart classrooms.

10. Requirement of more water purifiers in the college.


## **PARENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT** **(Session: 2022-23)**





In the academic year 2022-23, a joint meeting was convened by the Academic Development Cell in collaboration with the IQAC and R&D Cell to discuss on the feedback received from employers. The discussion encompassed various crucial aspects, and the following outcomes have been duly communicated to the teachers for effective and quality delivery of course curriculum:

1. While employers have rated our students as excellent across various quality parameters, there is a notable opportunity for improvement in organizational skills. The feedback from nearly half of the employers (47.37% of the total) indicating a good rating in this area highlights the need for increased emphasis on honing organizational skills, surpassing even the commendable performance in decision-making skills.
2. Additionally, it is imperative to focus on enhancing teamwork skills, problem-solving abilities, and punctuality among our students. These are key attributes that contribute significantly to a well-rounded professional, and addressing them will further strengthen the preparedness of our graduates for the workforce.
3. On a positive note, it is encouraging that all employers expressed a willingness to recruit graduates from our college. This favorable outcome underscores the overall strength of our academic programs and the high regard in which our graduates are held by employers, providing a solid foundation for future collaboration and success.


## **ALUMNI FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT** **(Session: 2022-23)**




1. How would you rate the practical relevance of the course content provided by Gauhati University in terms of its applicability to real life situations and enhancing employability?




2. How would you rate the mechanisms adopted by the college for the effective delivery of course content?




3. How would you rate the extra-curricular and co-curricular activities offered at the college in enhancing the overall student experience?




4. How would you rate the college's holistic approach, which prioritizes both the personal and academic growth of the students?




5. How would you rate the education quality in effectively imparting character-building lessons, fostering confidence, and creating opportunities for personality development?




6. How would you rate the usefulness and relevance of the education imparted at the college in your current job or higher education endeavours?




7. How would you rate your experience with the college's timeliness in addressing and resolving grievances?

1. The responses above 50 percent for all questions, excluding the one related to the practical relevance of Gauhati University's course content, collectively indicate a predominantly positive perception among respondents.
2. Alumni generally view the mechanisms for course delivery, extra-curricular the college's holistic approach, character-building and personality development, relevance to current job or higher education, timeliness in addressing grievances, overall learning experience, and effectiveness of communication with alumni.
3. This suggests a comprehensive satisfaction with various facets of the college experience, reflecting positively on the institution's educational, support, and engagement initiatives.
4. Therefore, teachers are being encouraged to organize additional co-curricular activities, focusing on capacity and personality development programs. Additionally, there is an emphasis on designing more add-on courses that complement the university's course content, making it more applicable to real-life situations and enhancing employability.
